- Advanced Placement (AP) exams and college entrance exams (PSAT and SAT) require additional fees.

ATHLETIC DEPARTMENT

The sports offered in the fall season are cheerleading, cross-country, field hockey, football, golf, soccer, and volleyball. These activities will begin on Saturday, August 15. THS will have a **"Meet the Fall Coaches" Night on Tuesday, August 11th at 7 P.M.** It is at this time that practice procedures and program information will be made available. Prior to trying out, all prospective athletes must complete the FCPS athletic paperwork packet **which includes obtaining a physical exam after May 31st, 2009**. This paperwork packet can be obtained in the THS main office. Upon being selected for a team, there is an athletic participation fee (per sport). IMMUNIZATION INFORMATION:

Will your child be going into preschool programs through 12th grade in the coming 2009-2010 school year – beginning August 24, 2009?

Under Maryland law, students enrolled in preschool programs through twelfth grade in the coming 2009-10 school year will need to provide schools documentation of immunizations against Hepatitis B and Chickenpox, also called Varicella in addition to the regular childhood vaccinations: DPT, polio, and MMR. For preschool children, Hib and Prevnar (PCV7) are required for those children younger than 60 months of age in addition to those immunizations previously mentioned.

What will happen if my child is not vaccinated?

Children who have not been vaccinated according to Maryland regulations will not be able to attend school – this means your child will be excluded from school until these vaccinations are received.

Where can I get my child vaccinated?

Contact your child's healthcare provider today to schedule an appointment. If your child does not have insurance or your insurance does not cover the cost of vaccinations contact the Frederick County Health Department Immunization Program at 301-600-3342. Once your child is vaccinated submit documentation to your child's school.

What if my child has already been vaccinated or had chickenpox?

School nurses are currently reviewing children's health records to ensure they have these vaccinations. Make sure your child's school health record is up-to-date with your child's vaccinations including history of chickenpox disease. Contact your child's healthcare provider to get a copy of your child's vaccination record and give it to the school nurse. **If your child had chickenpox provide your child's school nurse with the month and year your child had chickenpox.**
